HOLLYWOOD MUSICIAN TO PLAY FOR COPW



On Saturday May 21st, Gherman Markosian, a Hollywood studio musician and recording artist, will perform for COPW at its annual installation the at Biltmore Hotel. Mr. Markosian is a violist who began his musical studies at the age of 5 in the U.S.S.R. He studied at the Komitas Conservatory and studied with Grigori Zhislin in Moscow. Mr. Markosian came to the United States as a full merit scholar at the Thorton School of Music at USC.

Mr. Markosian has toured with Andrea Bocelli, Harry Connick Jr., Gwen Stefani, and was principal violist for Yanni's International Orchestra. He has recorded sound tracks for many movies e.g. Pirates of the Caribbean Series, Triple X, Unfaithful, Dream Catcher, Seabiscuit, etc..

As time permits, Mr. Markosian free lances with the Santa Barbara Chamber Orchestra, the California Philharmonic and the Pasadena Symphony Mr. Markosian will play at our installation with COPW member Stephanie Klopfleisch. They will play selections for piano and viola by Bach, Schubert, and Bartok.

COPW INSTRUMENT DRIVE MAKES MUSIC!

At the COPW Board meeting on March 3, the Board voted to endorse a vigorous effort to secure instruments for the youth who are participating in the two YOLA orchestras supported by the LA Phil. A committee composed of Colleen Robertson, Hermina Popovici, Julianna de Bruyn Kops, Inez Lopez, and chaired by Stephanie Klopfleisch has been busy ever since coordinating the outreach efforts. The approach was two fold:, solicit used instruments from friends and relatives, and secure money contributions to buy instruments from suppliers. A goal was to get 25-50 instruments by May 15 (the delivery date to the Phil). Thanks to the generousity and caring efforts of our COPW members we are already successful. As of April 21st we have:

12 instruments contributed – 2 complete viola sets, 1 tuba, 2 trombones, a cello, flute, violin set, drums, recorder, coronet, music stand

19 instruments purchased - 1 clarinet, 1 4/4 viola set, 2 trumpets, 2 ¾ violin sets, 1 ½ violin set, 1 trombone, sleigh bells, 2 triangles and hammers, 2 concert tambourines, cello bow, flute, 1 12" viola set, 1 guitar, 1 4/4 violin set and 1 french horn - our COPW symbol.

48 COPW members and friends contributed – either an instrument or funds to buy instruments

At our March 26 tea, Colleen Robertson led a spirited shout out auction to raise funds to purchase a French horn. However, so many people generously contributed it was possible to purchase many additional instruments. We still have money left to buy a few more instruments and I estimate we will have 40 instruments to contribute on May 15th. Anyone who would like to help bring the instruments to the Walt Disney concert Hall on Sunday, May 15th, should contact Stephanie Klopfleisch or Colleen Robertson. We'll have fun taking pictures at WDCH before we drop off our little orchestra of instruments! 

A TRIBUTE TO MEL JOHNSON

Mildred R. Johnson "Mel" a native Californian, died on March 23, 2011. Mel distinguished herself in her chosen career of banking, where she ascended from secretary to Vice President and manager of the Law Department of First Interstate Bank. Her strong intellect, talent and dedication contributed to her success in what was then a male dominated environment.

Mel was married for over fifty years to her late husband, Ray Johnson, with whom she shared a love of classical music, including symphony, chamber music and opera. Mel and Ray were avid sports fans and members of UCLA's Chancellor's Club. They held season tickets for football, basketball and tennis. Both were graduates of UCLA.

The Johnsons resided in Naples, Italy, during the Korean War, where Ray served in Naval intelligence. They also traveled extensively in the US and other countries, and they especially enjoyed traveling in California (Mel was a California history buff).

Mel joined COPW in 2004 and served on its Board of Directors, during which time she arranged access for COPW to the beautiful and historic William Andrews Clark Library, where on January 9, 2009 COPW celebrated its 45th anniversary at a very successful event chaired by Pat Chock and Martha Curtis.

Mel Will be remembered as an elegant and accomplished woman. I will miss Mel, a dear friend for more than 50 years.
